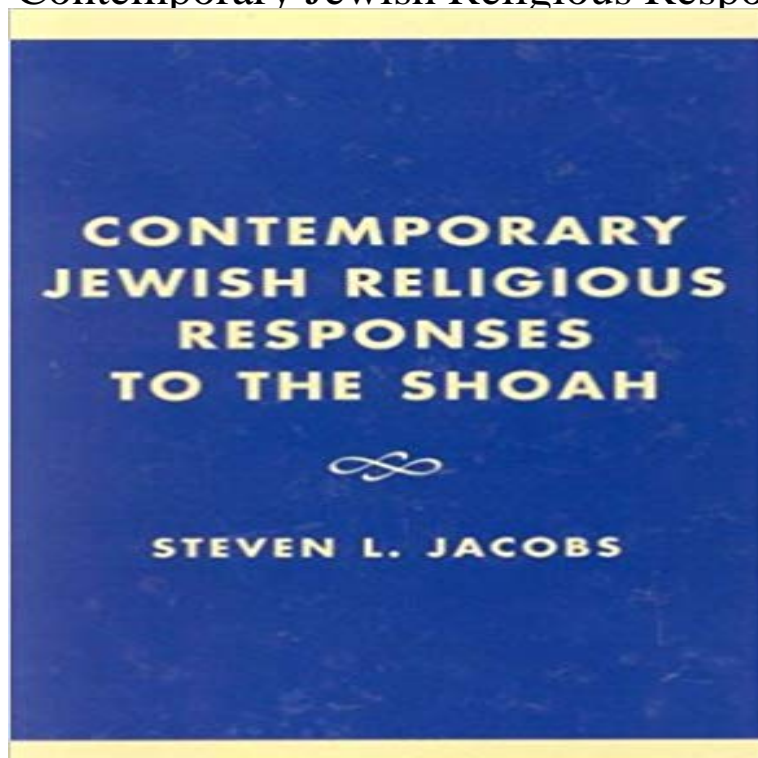


Contemporary Jewish Religious Responses to the Shoah
